## **The Tenth Anniversary of the Rome Statute and developments at the International Criminal Court**

The ICC is the first ever permanent judicial body with jurisdiction over genocide, crimes against humanity and war crimes. In this lecture, the Deputy Prosecutor will outline developments in the situations and cases currently before the Court: Northern Uganda, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Darfur Sudan and the Central African Republic, as well as other situations under analysis, including Colombia and Afghanistan.

Mrs Fatou Bensouda of the Gambia was elected Deputy Prosecutor by the Assembly of States Parties on 8 September 2004. She is in charge of the Prosecution Division of the Office of the Prosecutor. Prior to her election, Mrs. Bensouda worked as a Legal Adviser and Trial Attorney at the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda (ICTR) in Arusha, Tanzania, rising to the position of Senior Legal Adviser and Head of The Legal Advisory Unit.
